Genus & Species:	<i>Euphorbia characias</i> subsp. <i>wulfenii</i>
Protection Status:	US Plant Patent 19,027.
USDA Zone:	Zone 7. (0°F or -17°C).
Bloom:	Eye catching variegated bracts.
Bloom Time:	Early summer - fall.
Foliage:	Eye catching variegated foliage blue-green in color with crisp white margins.
Habit:	Tiny compact rounded habit. 18" x 18".
Propagation:	Softwood cuttings. <i>License required for propagation.</i>
Culture:	Well-drained soil in full sun.
Additional Comments:	Drought tolerant once established. Prune flowering stem hard back to the base after flowering to encourage strong new shoots.
Uses:	Pots & containers, garden border, modern landscape.

1 Quart:	6-8 weeks
1 Gallon:	10-12 weeks
