

Cercis 'Little Woody'

Key Features

Characteristics

Genus & Species:Cercis canadensisProtection Status:US Plant Patent 15,854.USDA Zone:USDA Zone 5. (-20°F or -28°C).

Bloom: Clusters of pink-violet sweet pea like blooms borne on the bare stems in early spring.

Bloom Time: Early spring.

Foliage: Deciduous, large round blue-green foliage. New shoots are copper in color.

Habit: Compact vase shaped habit. 10' x 8'. The perfect tree for smaller sized yards.

Propagation:Budding / Grafting & Tissue Culture. License required for propagation.Culture:Best grown in full sun to part shade in moist but well drained soils.

Additional Comments: Drought tolerant once established. Lightly trim as required. Uses: Garden specimen, landscape plantings.

5 Gallon: 24 months 15 Gallon: 36 months
