

# Cercis ‘Little Woody’

## Key Features

- ✓ One of the smallest & most distinctive redbuds introduced.
- ✓ Large blue-green rounded foliage.
- ✓ Tight compact habit making this the tree perfect for smaller sized yards.

## Characteristics

<b>Genus &amp; Species:</b>	<i>Cercis canadensis</i>
<b>Protection Status:</b>	US Plant Patent 15,854.
<b>USDA Zone:</b>	USDA Zone 5. (-20°F or -28°C).
<b>Bloom:</b>	Clusters of pink-violet sweet pea like blooms borne on the bare stems in early spring.
<b>Bloom Time:</b>	Early spring.
<b>Foliage:</b>	Deciduous, large round blue-green foliage. New shoots are copper in color.
<b>Habit:</b>	Compact vase shaped habit. 10’ x 8’. The perfect tree for smaller sized yards.
<b>Propagation:</b>	Budding / Grafting & Tissue Culture. <i>License required for propagation.</i>
<b>Culture:</b>	Best grown in full sun to part shade in moist but well drained soils.
<b>Additional Comments:</b>	Drought tolerant once established. Lightly trim as required.
<b>Uses:</b>	Garden specimen, landscape plantings.
