Characteristics

Genus & Species:	<i>Daphne x transatlantica</i>
Protection Status:	US Plant Patent 18,361.
USDA Zone:	USDA Zone 5. (-20°F or -28°C).
Bloom:	Profusions of tight heads of soft pink buds opening to pure white intensely scented blooms.
Bloom Time:	Early spring followed by constant succession from summer to fall.
Foliage:	Semi-evergreen, mid-green foliage.
Habit:	Excellent tight, rounded, compact habit 2' x 2' in 4 years. (Ultimately 3' x 3').
Propagation:	Semi ripe basal cuttings / Tissue Culture. <i>License required for propagation.</i>
Culture:	Best in full sun in acid or alkaline soil with good drainage.
Additional Comments:	Drought tolerant once established. Test result show great heat and humidity tolerance. Tolerant of pruning, best done after the spring flush of bloom, so very little flower is lost.
Uses:	Containers, garden specimen, mass landscape planting & low informal hedge
