Characteristics

Genus & Species:Liriodendron tulipiferaProtection Status:US Plant Patent 19,581.USDA Zone:USDA Zone 4. (-30°F or -34°C).

Bloom: Yellow green tulip flowers with vibrant orange color at base.

Bloom Time: Species blooms mid-summer.

Foliage:Deciduous small foliage, ⅓ the size of the species.Habit:Tidy upright broadly columnar habit 12' x 6' in 4 years.Propagation:Budding / Grafting. License required for propagation.Culture:Best grown in moist well drained soils in full sun.

Additional Comments: USA Native. 'Little Volunteer' may well become the 'Little Gem' magnolia of the Liriodendron

world.

Uses: Ideal for smaller yards, garden specimen, street trees, landscape plantings.
