

## Veronica 'Blue Yonder'

### Key Features

- ✓ Striking deep violet blue blooms.
- ✓ Tight creeping mat forming habit.
- ✓ Dark almost black stems really making the flowers pop.

### Characteristics

<b>Genus &amp; Species:</b>	<i>Veronica hybrid (Estimated V. allionii x liwanensis)</i>
<b>Protection Status:</b>	US Plant Patent 27,284.
<b>USDA Zone:</b>	USDA Zone 4. (-30°F or -34°C).
<b>Bloom:</b>	Abundant sprays of striking deep violet blue blooms.
<b>Bloom Period:</b>	Summer.
<b>Foliage:</b>	Small ovate to lance shaped dark green foliage, stems and petioles are dark almost black in color.
<b>Habit:</b>	Tight creeping mat forming habit. 4" x 15". (6" in flower)
<b>Propagation:</b>	Tip Cuttings. <i>License required for propagation.</i>
<b>Culture:</b>	Easily grown in full sun to partial shade, moist well-drained soil.
<b>Additional Comments:</b>	Drought tolerant once established. Attracts bees and butterflies.
<b>Uses:</b>	Containers, borders, mass landscape planting.

<b>1 Quart:</b>	<b>10-12 weeks</b>
<b>1 Gallon:</b>	<b>12-14 weeks</b>
